Two-person teams will compete in the "Best Ball" format, all hoping to add their names to the Leprechaun's Cup. Contests of putting and driving (a new event this year). as well as pin prizes will showcase the talents of participating golfers.

## all aboard for some cruisin' craic in cheodar-land

he summer is filled with many Irish fest opportunities and **Jim McGinn** is trying to Uput together a memorable getaway for us all this summer, a rollicking bus trip to the Aug. 16-19 Milwaukee Irish Fest.

"I'm hoping we can get 25 or so to go, but we're floating around 16 right now with room for more. The main thing is arranging for hotel rooms. We can block some rooms then have individuals make their own reservations," said McGinn.

The cost of the bus including the driver's hotel for two nights is right at \$3000. So cost per person is that amount divided by number on board. With 20 people the cost would be \$150 each for that part of the journey.

"I've inquired with a few hotels in downtown Milwaukee and think we could expect to be paying in the neighborhood of \$200 a day for a room. Room rate is for double occupancy so cost for single assuming there's a roommate would be around \$350 total for the trip. For a couple, the amount then would be around \$700.

"The bus I've researched will hold upwards of 35 people. A smaller vehicle's available, but only holds 21 and the price is virtually the same so the larger bus with more comfort and a restroom is the way to go," he said.

The plan is to arrive in Milwaukee on Friday mid-afternoon when people could choose dinner downtown & pubs or hitting the Fest, which is open 4-12 p.m. that day.

Festival hours are 12-12 p.m. on Saturday with music and other attractions. Check out the schedule at *irishfest.com*. An option for Sunday is 9 a.m. mass on the festival grounds with more music afterward.

"The Mass is something I would encourage all to attend even if not a practicing church goer. It's held in the ground's arena which holds upward of 10,000 people and is quite impressive. Entry to the grounds on Sunday is a food item donation. The grounds are not as crowded on Sunday so a good time to check out gift shops and more music," he said.

All would leave Milwaukee around 2 p.m. or so to get back to DM around 8:30.
