annual run breaks stride but a new course is clear

After the WDM police department told us that they would no longer provide police protection for our events, it was an all-hands-on-deck problem to relocate the coming **36th Annual St. Patrick's Day Run**. The City of DM gave us some downtown course options, but organizer John Leonhart and his buddy T. Michael Franke came up with a superb plan of their own, utilizing the areas shown in the map below.

"We were somewhat limited in a possible race area because we wanted to keep Sully's involved in our pre- and post-race activities," said Leonhart.

Unfortunately, the late planning has made advertising and publicity a little weak.

"This will probably adversely affect the number of entries, but the cost estimate from the DMPD is no more than we paid WDM, so that helps," he said.

The new run plan will offer 5K and 8K (5 mile) options (without a 10K for now). The map here shows the short route. The longer run will follow 51st St. farther north to Grand, then track to the east around the Art Center, south into Greenwood Park, and return west on the Bill Riley and Walnut Creek trails.

The entry app is on the FSOSP website and packets can be picked up from 2-5 p.m. at Sully's the day before the Sun., April 14 event.

Race day morning, packet pick-up time will be 9:30-10:30 at Sully's and the start will be at 11 a.m. just to the east across 1st St. at the Sands Volleyball parking lot, south of Pal Joey's Lounge. Parking is available there, also.

Post-race activities take place back at Sully's.

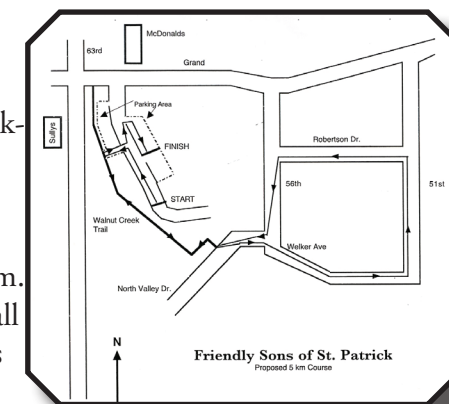
Volunteers are needed and can sign up at next week's meeting, or email Tony Orcutt at tony.orcutt@gmail.com.

Some of the course is on bike paths so some of the course control will be easier. Also, the shorter route means a water station may not be needed, but Leonhart may still decide to add one.

T-shirts, race numbers, blank entries and money will be delivered and on hand at Sully's, but volunteers are needed to handle the packet pick-up periods on Saturday and on Sunday morning.

Scholarships to one male and one female student track athlete will be awarded. Notices were sent to area school athletic directors and applicant submissions are due in a week. Winning recipients will be selected by a committee on April 10.

Kudos to Leonhart, Franke, Orcutt and Mike Murphy for dealing so masterfully with all the changeroonies in our annual run event. 🍀
