5K/10K RUN

 ${f F}$ or over 30 years this Sunday run has been held in the neighborhoods of WDM, an outing with a fine local focus for over 200 entrants each year.

The 10K component has not changed over time but in the last decade sponsor John Leonhart converted the 2 mile "fun run" to a 5K event. Also, a gradual move of the run date into late March has made the weather more ideal for runners.

Runners/walkers can register online for the 11 a.m. event and pick up packets from 2-5 p.m. the day prior at Sully's Pub. Race number/T-shirt pickups are made from 9:30 on at that pub sign-in location on Sunday morning, as well, and the event begins with a "shotgun" signal from the FSOSP Queen.

Volunteers make it all work by helping at the registration tables and along the route to direct runners and call out times.

Post-event festivities at Sully's Pub next door to the finish line make it a day-long celebration.

In connection to the race, the FSOSP board awards two \$500 scholarships to one boy and one girl high school student-participant, chosen from candidates recommended by area coaches.

ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

A highlight for the Friendly Sons, as well as for all green-blooded Irish descendants, each year is the St. Patrick's Day Parade, sponsored by the Sons on the actual St. Pat's Day, not the closest Saturday, as some cities prefer.

Grandfather Lawrence Patrick Greene, born in Co. Cork

in Jan. 1866, emigrated at the age of 30.

The celebration was organized in the mid-70's and for many years a one-mile parade route began at the Capitol and ended at Embassy Suites in the East Village where a public reception was held. In recent years, the route has changed, moving it to the Gateway West area, establishing the start at Exile Brewing and the reception site at the Marriott Hotel downtown. Each year, almost 30,000 people are drawn to this event.

Live music and other entertainment, including a performance by the Foy School of Irish Dance, are on display throughout the afternoon, culminating in the presentation of parade entry trophies, and the highly-anticipated drawing of the winners of the Lucky Draw raffle, where an annual top prize is a trip to the "auld sod" of Eire.

LEPRECHAUN OPEN

The Sons have had a love/hate affair with the frustrating and glorious Game of Golf for years.

Memories of golfing in the "Bad Old Days" barely survive through the Fog (that Fog being the result of Guinness and Jameson). But bits and pieces do float to the surface: Golf carts stuck in stream-beds, courses from which we are "Banned for Life," and alcohol fumes emanating from clubhouses to the degree they killed small birds for miles around. Tee times were made for 60, and 12 showed up to play. And so the Dream was dead.

But, after a hiatus of some years, there rose out of the depths (and debts) of that tragic era, a Champion. 



The Founding of the Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick of Central Iowa

According to founder Bob Conley/ when a group of buddies with Irish heritage decided that Des Moines needed an organization to celebrate and sustain that heritage they knew others had gone down the same path. The first chapter of the Society of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick was organized in Philadelphia in 1771/ just five years prior to the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The second chapter was established in New York City in 1784. That interest in Irish heritage spread west over the next 200 years/ there are now chapters throughout the United States as far as Hawaii. The chapters are not formally affiliated.

Conley explained that he and his brother Raymond (now deceased) organized the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick of Central lowa along with six friends: Tom Mahedy/ Phil Maloney/ Jimmy Murphy/ Rod Ryan/ Jimmy Piazza/ and Kevin Sullivan. The founders began organizing in 1975/ looking forward to holding an initial event on St. Patrick's Day of the following year. It took a few informal brainstorming meetings involving some adult beverages to focus their wits. Their effort began with information contacts with several existing Friendly Son chapters/ including both of the initial U.S. chapters. Philadelphia responded with its bylaws and other information.

.

It was learned that besides a parade/ many chapters held a formal dinner on St. Patrick's Day. After reviewing the practices of other chapters/ Conley said/ the Des Moines boys decided to start with the tradition established by the Friendly Sons of San Diego - a stag/ black tie formal dinner. In cities with this tradition/ the annual St. Patrick's Day dinner is a noteworthy social event attended by prominent politicians/ community leaders/ and other "gentry."

A black tie dinner was organized on St. Patrick's Day of 1976 as the chapter's inaugural event and was held at the Holiday Inn Downtown as a charitable fundraiser for Hospice of Central Iowa/ raising \$1/000. Piazza claimed there was a spot of nepotism involved with the charity selection since the Conley's mother was a founder of hospice. However/ it didn't stop Piazza from playing the piano for that fine dinner/ reported Conley. Other charitable efforts in the early years included support for children orphaned by the troubles in Northern Ireland.

Within a year or so/ the seven founders found themselves joined by a thriving organization of 240 members/
including many who held officer positions in later years. It was decided to forego the black tie dinner in the future.
The initial focus was on charity/ celebration of lrishness/ getting together/ and having a good time.
Although death/ relocation/ sobriety/ growth in other interests/ and other normal cycles of life have claimed many of
the original members/ at least two/ Bob Conley and Rod Ryan/ regularly attend meetings to this day.
